

## Lesson 18

### Teacher Instructions

Read the words in **bold** out loud to your learner.

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Today, you will learn about a new sound. Sometimes, two letters work together to make one sound.

(point to *ph*)

These two letters, *p* and *h*, work together to make the sound *ph*.

You hear the *ph* sound at the beginning of the word *phone*.

Say the word *phone*. What sound do you hear at the beginning? (pause for the child to answer)

That's right! *Ph* makes the *ph* sound.

Say the *ph* sound three times: *ph, ph, ph* (point to the *ph* each time)

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Practice your letter sounds. Point to each letter and say its sound.

Practice reading these words. Remember, when you say sounds together fast, they make a word.

Point to each word as you read it.

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Point to each word as you read the sentences.



After the Lesson:

*Point to each word as you read.*
